



Doctors of the World is looking for two Indigenous Navigators for national operations in Montreal

Doctors of the World Canada has chosen to focus its efforts on marginalized populations throughout the island of Montreal. We work with street youth, sex workers, IDUs, Indigenous people experiencing homelessness, migrants with precarious status, homeless individuals, and individuals with mental health problems.

Under the supervision of the Indigenous Navigator Project Coordinator and supported by the Clinical Coordinator, the Indigenous Navigator:

- Acts in prevention of STBBIs (enhances screening, vaccination, etc.)
- Serves as a bridge between vulnerable Indigenous populations and public system resources where possible, or Mdm services
- Intervenes with Indigenous people based on needs identified by them
- Uses empowerment and collaborates with the accompanied person to arrange follow-up as needed
- Acts as a facilitator between the accompanied person and the professionals of the public health system
- Distributes sterile protective equipment
- Participates in intervention plans with professionals from different teams involved in services
